# WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

The dual enrollment program allows eligible high school students to earn college credit while still attending high school. College credits earned through dual enrollment may often be applied toward high school graduation requirements!







# ADVANTAGES

- Save money –many school districts will pay the full tuition cost
- Get a jump start on college courses
- Earn high school and college credit at the same time
- Earn college credits that may easily transfer to other colleges both in and out of state

## CRITERIA

- Must be a high school student
- Must possess a cumulative high school GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must receive approval from a parent/legal guardian, HS counselor, and your principal to participate in the program
- Must meet with high school counselor to discuss requirements and eligible courses.
- Junior/Senior level students may register for 3 courses per semester

# COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

A <u>Photo ID</u> is required for all business conducted at Mott Community College (MCC)

### **Apply for Admission**

**Orientation\*:** MCC 3 hour orientation is required of all new students (schedule an appointment)

 Topics covered: College expectations, policies, services, and student account information.

Placement Testing:\* Results of the 2 hour placement test taken at our campus will determine college course eligibility. (Main campus walk-in basis)

• Students will test in English, Math, and Reading. A writing sample may be required.

ACT scores of 22 or above in Math and 20 or above in English and Reading may waive corresponding portions of the test. Documentation is required.

### **Course Requirements:**

- All students must meet minimum class requirements/prerequisites.
- 9th & 10th grade students will need instructors approval and college counselor recommendation.

\*Orientation and placement testing may be taken at any of our branch centers.

# ENROLLMENT STEPS

Meet with your high school guidance counselor to find out if you are eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program. If you are eligible, follow these seven easy steps to enroll:

- 1. Submit to MCC Admissions Office
  - Admissions Application
  - Dual Enrollment Certification Form
  - High School Transcript
- 2. Attend new student orientation
- **7** Take the Placement Assessment Test
  - If ACT was taken, bring the scores with you.
- 4. Register for classes
- Class Payment
  - MCC will bill the your Community School District.
- 6 Buy Books
  - Students are responsible for the costs of books and supplies.
- **7** Go to class!
