Placement in the Pre-Program pool does not guarantee admission into the PTA program. A maximum of 24 students are admitted to the program yearly in the Winter semester. The deadline for receipt of Supplemental application packet and Verification of Physical Therapy Observation is April 15 of each year. Once eligibility is determined, students will be invited to participate in the mandatory pre-program course OTPT 113. Students will be considered for in-program placement according to the following conditions:

1. Successful completion of OTPT 113 and BIO 151 with a 2.5 or greater, and
2. Ranking based on a value points system with consideration to overall GPA, BIO 151 grade, OTPT 113 grade, and prior degree status.
